



ORIGINS OF THE 3 WIRE NAME

When performing conventional leveling measurements, surveyors have come to rely on the method of reading the rod at all 3 wires visible in the scope. In recording these seemingly "extra" observations, the surveyor can quickly check the reading observed at the horizontal crosshair by averaging the readings observed at the top and bottom stadia. This method provides a quick redundant observation to check the single reading at the crosshair, providing accurate and consistent results without the need for a separate observation to confirm the initial reading.
